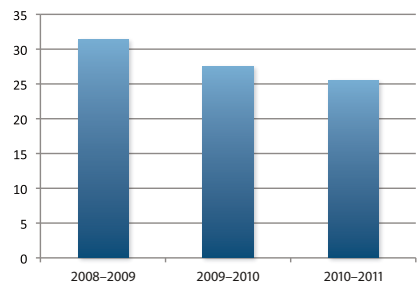

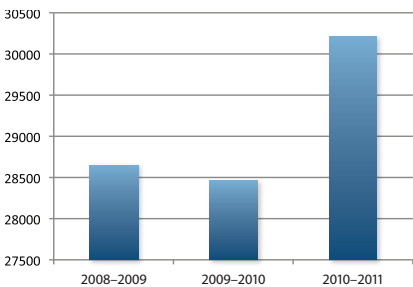

THREE YEAR TRENDS

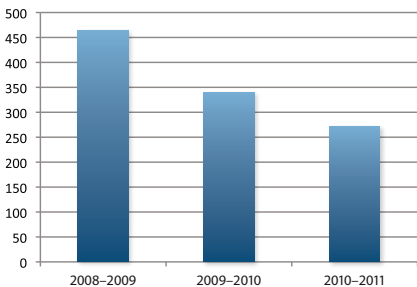
Fiscal Yrs. 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11



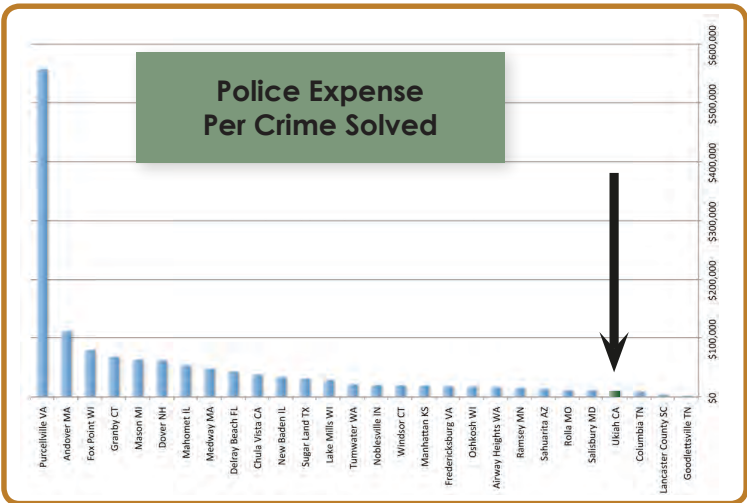
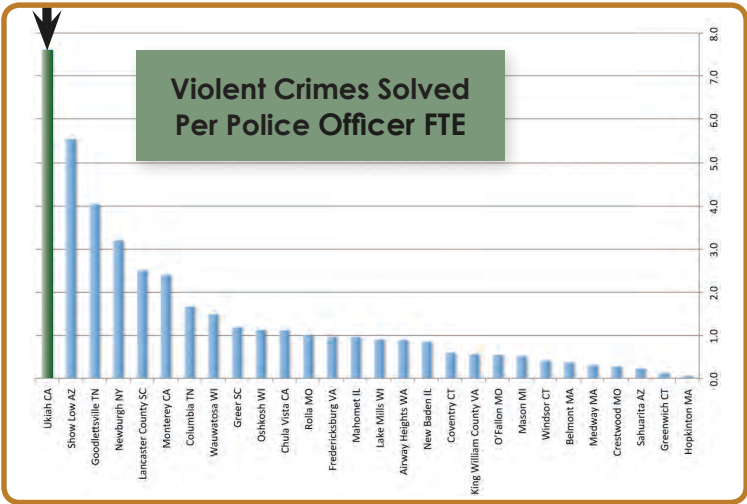
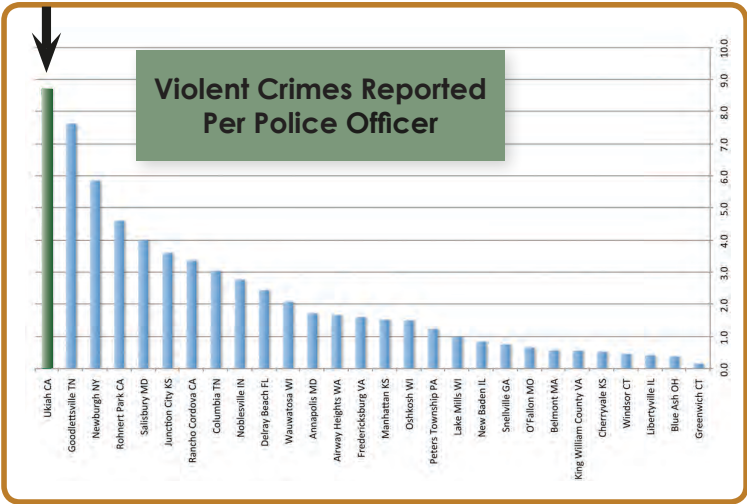
Sworn Officers Decreased from 32 to 26

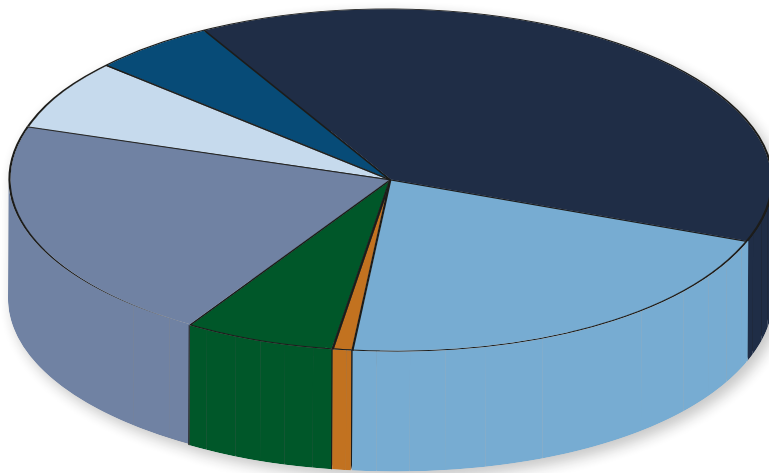

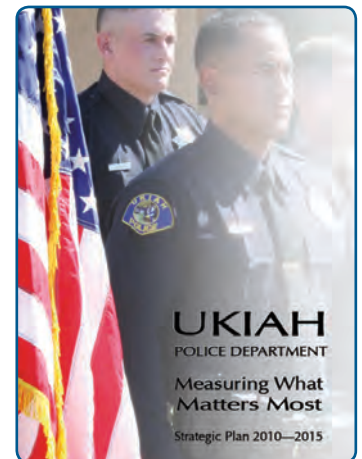
