Statistics

Arrests included: 16 for public intoxication, 5 warrant arrests, 3 for violating probation or parole, 3 for resisting arrest, 3 for domestic violence, 2 for shoplifting, 2 for possessing stolen property, and 1 each for; battery on school grounds, possessing methamphetamine and cocaine for sale, threats, hate crime, child endangerment, accessory to a crime, providing false identity to law enforcement, and possessing concentrated cannabis for sale. Probation or parole holds were placed on 3 of these arrests.

Officers investigated 2 traffic collisions, and 1 death by natural causes. Two vehicles were impounded for 30 days due to the drivers being unlicensed or suspended.

Officers took reports of: 8 thefts, 8 found property, 3 vandalism, 3 missing persons, 2 abandoned vehicles, 2 burglaries, 2 suicidal subjects, and 1 each of; battery, contributing to delinquency of minors, animal bite, battery on school grounds, unlawful sex with a minor, stolen vehicle and domestic violence.

Officers assisted the Mendocino Major Crimes Task Force with a narcotics investigation.

Highlights for the Week

On May 17th at about 1:50 PM Ukiah Police stopped a vehicle in the 200 block of South Dora Street for traffic violations. The vehicle had 5 occupants and smelled strongly of marijuana. A rear passenger, 20 year old Dakota Jack Blunt of Willits, was found in possession of approximately 8 grams of concentrated cannabis. Located in the vehicle concealed under clothing where Blunt had been sitting, was approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ pound of concentrated cannabis. Blunt was arrested for possessing concentrated cannabis for sale.

On May 18th at about 11:05 PM Ukiah Police responded to the Pear Tree Center, in the 500 block of East Perkins Street, for a domestic violence incident. Apparently a male and female were seen shoving then punching one another, and the male had run to the glass door of Ross Dress for Less and pounded on the windows asking for someone to call the police. The subjects were identified as 28 year old Scotty Lee Willis and 23 year old Kelisha Sheree Alvarez, of Ukiah, who were both arrested for domestic violence.

On May 18th at about 11:35 PM Ukiah Police responded to the Motel 6, at 1208 South State Street, for a loud party in one of the rooms. Officers locate 11 juveniles inside the room, ranging in age from 15 to 17 years old, and all of whom were under the influence of alcohol or marijuana, or both. A 17 year old female juvenile began vomiting, and was found to be so inebriated she was transported to the hospital by ambulance and later released to her parents. Seven of the remaining juveniles were released to their parents at the scene, and two 16 year old male juveniles and a 17 year old male juvenile were arrested for public intoxication. It was determined the room had been rented by an 18 year old adult, and charges of child endangerment and contribution to the delinquency of minors is being sought against that subject.

On May 19th at about 2:35 AM Ukiah Police responded to a reported battery that had just occurred. The victim reported going for a walk when a subject yelled repeated derogatory comments to the victim, regarding homosexuality. The suspect then approached the victim, and punched the victim repeatedly in the face and made additional comments about homosexuality. Officers were told the victim was homosexual, and had likely been assaulted because of this. Officers also spoke with witnesses in the area who corroborated the victim's statement. The victim identified the residence the suspect had fled into, and officers located 22 year old Edward Two-Feathers Steele, intoxicated, and hiding in a bathtub inside the residence. The victim identified Steele as the suspect, and Steele was arrested for battery, committing a hate crime, and violating parole.

On May 19th at about 2:25 PM Ukiah Police responded to a residence in the 300 block of Ford Street for a burglary in progress. Officers were advised that neighbors were reporting 3 suspects, one of whom was in the backyard of an unoccupied residence, and another apparently acting as a "look-out" in front. The first officer to arrive located a subject in the back yard who fled on foot and jumped a fence into another yard, refusing orders from the officer to stop. The officer pursued the suspect who jumped another fence, falling approximately 25' into the creek, then proceeded through the water and stopped under a bridge. With assistance from other officers the suspect was directed out from under the bridge, identified as 24 year old Brenden Anthony Alicea, and arrested for resisting arrest. Alicea claimed he was attempting to retrieve his cat from the backyard of the residence, and the remaining subjects were contacted who corroborated this information. Alicea apologized for running, stating he was scared.

On May 19th at about 9:05 PM Ukiah Police observed a vehicle run the stop sign on Walnut Street at Dora Street. The vehicle stopped in the middle of the intersection, then turned into the on-coming lane and was stopped in the 200 block

of North Dora Street. The driver, 39 year old Octavio Chavez-Rosales of Hopland, had been drinking and was found to be too intoxicated to drive and was arrested for DUI. Also in the vehicle were another adult, and a 7 year old and 11 year old child. Chavez-Rosales was additionally charged with child endangerment.

On May 22nd at about 6:55 PM, A Ukiah Police Department Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle on Highway 101 at Gobbi Street. The driver, Jacki Lyn Scott (age 48 of Willits), was found to be driving with a suspended license, and the officer saw a small amount of methamphetamine in a plastic baggie upon her opening a zippered compartment of her wallet. The officer then located two ounces of cocaine and 5 ounces of methamphetamine in her vehicle. Jacki Scott was arrested for possession for sale and transportation for sale of cocaine and methamphetamine. Jacki Scott also had a Mendocino County Misdemeanor traffic warrant for her arrest. A subsequent search warrant was served by the Mendocino Major Crimes Task Force of Jacki Scott's residence in Willits, discovering 103 Marijuana plants, a half ounce of cocaine, scales, packaging material, and indicia of sales. Jacki Scott was booked into the County Jail.
