PRESS RELEASE

During the month of September, 2012, the Ukiah Police Department has received an increase in suspicious and criminal activity reported in one of its residential areas. The areas involved include Highland Avenue, Yokayo Court, Park Place, West Smith Street, West Standley Street, Cochrane Avenue, Live Oak Avenue, West Church Street, Mendocino Avenue, and South Spring Street. The activity reported involves a large amount of thefts from unlocked vehicles and mail thefts, but includes an attempted residential burglary and the theft of a motorcycle. This activity has occurred during both daytime and nighttime hours.

The Ukiah Police Department would like to remind its residents to remain vigilant in deterring this type of activity by keeping the doors to their vehicles, their house, storage buildings, and garages locked, and to store their valuables in a safe and secure manner. Reports of suspicious person(s) or crimes in progress, occurring at the time, should be made by telephone by calling the Ukiah Police Department at 463-6262, or 911 if it is an emergency.
