Patrol Division Weekly Activity Report 1/2/14 to 1/8/14

Statistics

Arrests included: 10 for public intoxication, 9 for under the influence of a controlled substance and/or possessing drug paraphernalia, 5 warrant arrests, 3 for resisting arrest, 2 for shoplifting, and 1 each for: possessing methamphetamine, domestic violence, possessing a narcotic, theft, and possessing methamphetamine for sale. Probation or parole holds were placed on 4 of these arrests.

Officers investigated 1 traffic collision. Two vehicles were stored for 30 days due to the drivers being unlicensed or suspended.

Officers took reports of: 6 burglaries, 4 found property, 4 thefts, 3 suicidal subjects, 3 child neglect, 2 missing persons, 2 vandalisms, 2 abandoned vehicles, and 1 each of; rape, domestic violence, possession of fireworks, battery, identity theft, and animal bite.

Highlights for the Week

On January 1st at about 1:45 AM Ukiah Police responded to a disturbance in the 700 block of South Dora Street wherein multiple subjects fled upon the officers' arrival. Several subjects were believed to have jumped a fence and headed into the area of Carolyn Street. An officer saw 21 year old Jessica Nicole Clayton, of Ukiah, walking from the corner of a residence in the 100 block of Carolyn Street. Clayton was on probation with a term that precluded her from possessing ammunition. Clayton had several rounds of live ammunition in her pocket, and was arrested for violating probation. A criminal history check revealed Clayton was a convicted felon, and was additionally charged with being a felon in possession of ammunition. 14-0001

On January 1st at about 7:05 PM Ukiah Police responded to the Voll Motel, at 628 North State Street, for a male subject who had attempted to kick in a door. Officers located the suspect in the 200 block of Mason Street, and identified him as 41 year old Daniel Brian Dolan, of Nice, who had been drinking. Dolan was on parole and prohibited from consuming alcohol, and possessed a knife with a blade larger than allowed by terms of state parole. Dolan had warrants for his arrest from Lake County for violating parole, and Glendale, California, for assault with a deadly weapon. Dolan was arrested and booked into the County Jail for the warrants, and for public intoxication and violating parole. 14-0005

On January 2nd at about 3:45 PM Ukiah Police contacted 24 year old Shayla Dawn Guerrero, of Covelo, in the 300 block of East Gobbi Street. Guerrero had a warrant for her arrest for violating probation, and was taken into custody. Guerrero had a methamphetamine smoking pipe in her possession, and was charged with possession of drug paraphernalia. Guerrero admitted to having used methamphetamine recently, and after being medically cleared for a temporary medical condition that could potentially be affected by drug use, Guerrero was booked into the County Jail. 14-0009

On January 3rd at about 1:45 AM Ukiah Police were in the area of Hospital Drive and Hamilton Street investigating a shooting in the area call. The officers saw a bicyclist traveling behind the Home Depot without proper lighting, and attempted to stop the bicyclist by yelling to him to stop. The bicyclist refused to stop, and rode around the officer who attempted to block the bicyclist's path. The officers pursued the subject who rode west to Hamilton Drive and fled north, then turned west on Clara Avenue. The officers caught up to the suspect in the 200 block of Clara Avenue and tackled the suspect from his bicycle and took him into custody. The suspect, 40 year old Fernando Elston Fabian, of Ukiah, stated he ran because he had smoked marijuana and was paranoid. Fabian was booked into the County Jail for fleeing from law enforcement. 14-0014

On January 3rd at about 9:35 PM Ukiah Police responded to Lucky's, at 504 East Perkins Street, for a woman who had attempted to shoplift from the store. Officers located the suspect in the 100 block of Hamilton Street, and identified her as 24 year old Katie Ann Sanchez, of Ukiah. Sanchez had used methamphetamine recently, and was arrested for being under the influence of a controlled substance. After being medically cleared for a temporary medical condition potentially affected by drug use, Sanchez was booked into the County Jail. 14-0022

On January 4th at about 2:05 PM a Ukiah Police Officer was driving in the 800 block of Waugh Lane and noticed 36 year old David Lee Waltz, of Lancaster, and another subject standing together on the roadside. The officer had assisted with the investigation of a hit and run traffic collision several days prior involving Waltz, and remembered he was on probation with a search clause in Yolo County for transporting a controlled substance. Waltz and the other subject were facing each other, and upon seeing the officer both immediately looked downward and Waltz walked towards a nearby bush. The officer quickly turned around and contacted Waltz as the other subject had quickly left. Another officer arrived and spoke with Waltz while a search of Waltz and his nearby vehicle was conducted. A roll of plastic wrap was located under the driver's seat of Waltz' vehicle. Waltz displayed a calm demeanor while speaking with the cover officer until the investigating officer concluded searching the vehicle, returned to the roadside and stood near the bush. Waltz became noticeably nervous and was heard to stutter, and looked nervously at the officer's feet. The officer looked down and noticed a piece of rolled up plastic wrap under the corner of the bush. The officer found the plastic wrap contained 3 baggies of methamphetamine, totaling over 10 grams. Waltz conceded the baggies contained methamphetamine, and was arrested for possessing methamphetamine for sale. 14-0027

On January 4th at about 1:55 AM Ukiah Police stopped a bicyclist in the 100 block of Thomas Street. The bicyclist provided a variation of his name and date of birth to officers, and was later identified as 20 year old Aaryan Devon Fischer, of Ukiah. As the officers were speaking with Fischer he suddenly fled, running east on Thomas Street and continuing south on Perry Street. As the officers were running after Fisher and attempting to stop him, he pushed an officer to the ground and continued fleeing. A second officer caught up to Fisher and held him to the ground while attempting to take him into custody. Fisher violently resisted the officer, and swung his elbow towards the officer numerous times trying to strike the officer. The second officer attempted to control Fisher who continued to push and swing his elbow towards officers, and officers finally deployed a Taser before being able to take Fisher into custody. Both the officers and Fisher received minor injuries from the violent struggle, and Fisher was medically cleared then booked into the County Jail for resisting arrest and battery upon a police officer. A third officer had responded, and began searching the area for contraband as the pursuing officers believed Fisher may have discarded something while fleeing. The third officer was

approached by 31 year old Jeffrey Allan Murray, of Ukiah, in front of a residence in the 100 block of Thomas Street. Murray admitted he possessed marijuana, which the officer found in one of Murray's pockets, and also found Murray possessed a tablet of oxycontin, a commonly abused narcotic. Murray was arrested for illegally possessing a narcotic. 14-0023/14-0024

On January 5th at about 2:00 AM Ukiah Police responded to the corner of North State Street and Standley Street for 4 subjects fighting. Responding officers contacted all 4 subjects, one of whom was identified as 29 year old Don Michael Leroy Childberg, of Ukiah. Childberg had been drinking heavily and was staggering and bleeding from the mouth. Childberg ignored simple commands from the officers, and a witness reported Childberg had started the fight by attempting to hit one of the subjects, who in turn punched Childberg in self-defense. Childberg was arrested for public intoxication and booked into the County Jail. 14-0033

On January 4th at about 7:05 PM Ukiah Police responded to Safeway, at 653 South State Street, for a shoplifter. Responding officers found Safeway security struggling with 51 year old Thomas Lee Sanders, of Missouri. Officers learned Sanders had earlier entered the store and asked the security officer where "the girly stuff" was. Security determined Sanders was seeking hair dye for his beard, and directed him to the proper location within the store. After selecting hair dye, Sanders was seen placing the item into his jacket pocket then leave the store without paying. Security detained Sanders outside, and located the stolen item hidden in Sanders' jacket. Sanders threw the hair dye into the bushes then tried to run away, and struggled with security until police arrived. Sanders was arrested for shoplifting. 14-0030

On January 6th at about 4:35 PM Ukiah Police responded to Safeway, at 653 South State Street, for an intoxicated subject. Officers learned security had observed 29 year old David Tapia Martinez, of San Francisco, staggering around the store with an unopened bottle of alcohol. The security officer determined Martinez was heavily intoxicated and escorted him out of the store. Martinez was arrested for public intoxication. 14-0044

On January 7th at about 2:15 PM Ukiah Police responded to Safeway, at 653 South State Street, for an intoxicated subject. Officers located 30 year old Steven Charles Luna, of Napa, walking away from the store and yelling and waving his arms at Safeway employees. Luna had been drinking heavily, and was arrested for public intoxication. 14-0055

On January 8th at about 5:00 AM Ukiah Police responded to the 500 block of North State Street for an intoxicated subject causing a disturbance. Officers contacted 51 year old Thomas Lee Sanders, of Missouri, and arrested him for public intoxication. 14-0062

On January 8th at about 6:55 PM Ukiah Police responded to Wal-Mart, at 1155 Airport Park Boulevard, for a shoplifting in progress. Store employees were observing 33 year old Basilio Reymundo Anguiano, of Ukiah, who had been previously arrested for shoplifting at Wal-Mart, and who was observed by store employees shoplifting on December 27, 2013, when he took around \$100.00 worth of electronics but was able to evade store employees.

During this incident, store employees observed Anguiano conceal a video game controller and begin walking towards the exit. Anguiano fled and was seen heading south towards Staples. Responding officers located Anguiano in front of Staples, at 1225 Airport Park Boulevard, and confirmed he had two warrants for his arrest for theft and for being under the influence of a controlled substance. Officers arrested Anguiano, and located less than a gram of methamphetamine inside his pants pocket, and the game controller in his backpack. Anguiano was charged with possessing methamphetamine and possessing stolen property, and a charge of shoplifting is being sought with the District Attorney for the December 27th theft. 14-0070
