Statistics

Arrests included: 7 warrant arrests, 6 for public intoxication, 4 for DUI, 3 for possession of methamphetamine, 2 for resisting arrest, 2 for vandalism, and one each for being under the influence of a controlled substance and/or possessing drug paraphernalia, violation of probation, possession of methamphetamine for sale, disturbing the peace, burglary, battery with injury, spousal abuse, violation of parole. Probation or parole holds were placed on 6 of these arrests.

Officers investigated 2 traffic collisions.

Officers investigated and took reports of: 6 found property, 4 abandoned vehicles, 2 vehicle thefts, 2 suspected child abuse, 2 animal bite, and 1 each for; domestic violence, missing person, child abuse, vandalism, fraud, rape, burglary, use of force, and city code violation.

The Patrol Division's average response time to in-progress calls was about 4 ½ minutes. The average response time to all other calls was about 12 minutes.

Ukiah Officers assisted the Mendocino County Major Crimes Task Force and the Mendocino County Sheriff's Office.

Highlights for the Week

On 07/03/2015 at about 135 AM, a Ukiah Police Officer was conducting a security check at the Pear Tree Center when a young male juvenile was seen attempting to hide from the officer. Upon the officer's attempt to contact the juvenile, the juvenile ran from the officer. Officers searched the area and the juvenile was found hiding in the immediate area and was determined to be intoxicated and in violation of his probation. The juvenile was arrested for public intoxication, resisting arrest and violation of probation. 15-1908

On 7/3/2015 at about 425 PM Ukiah Police observed 33 year old Ukiah resident Jose Ramirez walking on the sidewalk in the 700 block of S. State St. The officer recognized Ramirez and knew he had an active Mendocino County Misdemeanor Warrant out for his arrest. When the officer attempted to contact Ramirez he ran into traffic crossing S. State St. twice in an attempt to evade the officer. As the officer chased after Ramirez, Ramirez was seen throwing an object away as he tripped and fell onto the ground. Ramirez was taken into custody without further incident and a search of the immediate area where Ramirez had thrown the object resulted in officers finding a large plastic baggie containing 13½ grams of crystal methamphetamine. A search of Ramirez's person resulted in the recovery of a small digital scale, glass smoking pipe and smaller plastic baggies. Ramirez was determined to also be on probation. Ramirez was arrested for possession of a controlled substance for sale, possession of drug paraphernalia, resisting arrest, violation of probation and for the active arrest warrant issued out of this county. 15-1916

On 07/05/2015 at about 1231 AM Ukiah Police responded to the Forest Bar at 239 N. State Street for a physical fight in progress reportedly involving six people. When Officers arrived on scene they observed multiple subjects in front of the bar directing their attention towards two male subjects walking away. When officers attempted to contact these two subjects, both began fleeing from officers. Officers chased after the two subjects and were able to stop them in the 300 block of N. State St where they were both taken into custody in the 300 block of N. State Street without further incident. The two subjects were identified as 20 year old Rodolfo Alvarez and 21 year old Dimas Ceja who was found to have blood on his shirt and a small laceration on his face. Both were arrested for resisting arrest and upon further investigation no one desired to press charges for the assaults that occurred during the altercation at the bar. 15-1933

On 7/8/2015 at about 209 AM Ukiah Police responded to the 700 block of N. Bush St. for a report of subjects tampering with a motorcycle. The owner of the motorcycle reported that the subjects appeared to be male juveniles and were attempting to steal a motorcycle that was parked in the front yard of the residence. The owner watched the juveniles as they began to push the motorcycle forward and feared that the juveniles would steal his motorcycle, the owner yelled out his window, causing them to flee from the yard, running southbound on N. Bush Street. As officers began searching the area they located two male juveniles attempting to hide. The two juveniles were detained and later identified by the motorcycle's owner as being the same two subjects he had seen tampering with his motorcycle. Both juveniles were arrested for prowling and tampering with a vehicle. 15-1952

On 07/08/2015 at about 1110 AM, Ukiah Police responded to Oak Manor Park, 500 Oak Manor Drive, due to 29 year old Ukiah resident Ryan Cranford being seen in the park. Cranford was currently being sought for three active arrest warrants issued out of this county. Upon officers arrival Cranford was found hiding inside the portable restroom and was arrested without incident. During a search of his person Cranford was found to be in possession of crystal methamphetamine and was additionally charged with possession of methamphetamine and violation of his probation. 15-1957

On 7/9/15 at about 217 AM Ukiah Police observed a blue Subaru parked idling with its headlights on along the west side of the Tapestry Family Services Building, 290 E. Gobbi St. When officers began checking the vehicle they observed a small child sleeping in a car seat secured in the backseat of the vehicle. The vehicle's radio was playing music, the windows were down, and the doors were unlocked. Officers began checking the immediate area for a parent without success and after 30 minutes of searching the area 31 year old Potter Valley resident Ty Simpson was observed exiting from bushes that boarder a residential property located on Marshall Ave. Upon contact with Simpson he was found to be in possession of property that came from inside the residence on Marshall Ave. The residents were contacted by officers and were unaware that Simpson had been inside their home while they slept. Simpson was arrested for burglary and child endangerment. Child Protective Services was contacted and took custody of the child. 15-1961
