Press Release: Contact turns into arrest of felon with loaded handgun Ukiah Police Department case # 17-1237

On May 1st at about 9:37 am, UPD officers contacted a male subject in the 600 block of South Orchard Avenue. The subject identified himself as Brett Michael Adame age 25, out of Florissant Missouri. While talking with Adame the officer asked Adame if he had any weapons on his person. Adame told the officer he had a pry bar concealed in his waistband. For officer safety an officer conducted a pat search of Adame for weapons. Adame was found not only to have this this pry bar, but had a loaded 45 caliber semi auto handgun. The handgun was rendered safe and Adame was detained, while officers continued to investigate. A records check of the firearm revealed that it had been stolen out of Florissant Missouri. Adame's criminal history was check and he was found to have prior felony convictions. Adame was placed under arrest for felon in possesion of a firearm, felon in possession of ammunition, and possession of a baton, then booked into county jail.
