Statistics

Arrests included: 9 warrant arrests, 1 under the influence of a controlled substance, 4 public intoxication arrests, 3 shopliftings, 2 possession of methamphetamine, 2 domestic violence, 1 assault, 1 assault with a deadly weapon, 1 theft of a vehicle.

Officers investigated and took reports of: 6 towed vehicles, 6 vandalisms, 11 found property reports, 3 missing persons, 2 dog bite reports, 3 thefts, 1 ID theft, 1 theft of a vehicle, 4 traffic collisions, 3 mental health cases, 1 fraud report.

The Patrol Division's average response time to in-progress calls was just over 3 minutes. The average response time to all calls was just over 9 minutes.

Highlights for the Week

On May 3rd, at approximately 6:58 am, a UPD officer located a male subject he recognized as Robert Bass, a 57 year old Ukiah resident, at Safeway. The officer knew Bass to have several warrants for his arrest. The officers contacted Bass and advised him of the warrants. Bass was issued a citation and provided him with a court appearance date. 17-1248

On May 3rd, at approximately 3:20pm, a UPD officer responded to the 200 block of N. Oak St. regarding an intoxicated subject. Upon arrival, the officer located the subject identified as Alan Holliday, a 47 year old transient. The officer observed Holliday displaying signs of alcohol intoxication. Holliday was placed under arrest for public intoxication and booked into county jail. 17-1259

On May 5th, at approximately 12:50am, a UPD officer was patrolling the 600 block of N. State St. when he located a male he recognized as Andrew Holm, a 24 year old transient. The officer knew Holm to have multiple warrants for his arrest. The officer contacted Holm and advised him of the warrants. Holm was taken into custody without incident and booked into county jail. 17-1272

On May 5th, at approximately 8:05pm, a UPD officer was dispatched to Home Depot for a report of a male causing a disturbance at the location. Upon arrival, the officer located the subject identified as Daniel Nicholas, a 61 year old transient. The officer observed Nicholas displaying signs and symptoms of alcohol intoxication. After refusing to comply with the officer, Nicholas was placed under arrest for public intoxication and resisting arrest. 17-1284

Press Release: Subject fires arrow at victim and is arrested **UPD case # 17-1302**

On May 7th at about 3:03 pm, UPD officers were dispatched to an apartment complex in the 100 block of Norton Street, regarding a physical altercation. While in-route, officers were advised that a white male adult with a compound bow was threatening to shoot someone. Upon arrival, officers contacted and detained Stanley Klinges, a 34-year-old Ukiah resident, and then spoke with witnesses and victims. During the subsequent investigation officers learned that Klinges had been inside his apartment, when he observed an adult male subject whom he recognized arriving by vehicle. This adult male associates with a neighbor, whom Klinges believed was dealing drugs. Also inside the vehicle were the adult male's wife and two children. Klinges contacted the male subject, confronted him and an argument ensued. Klinges then went into his residence, got his compound bow and shot an arrow at the adult male. The arrow missed the adult male and lodged itself into the side of an outside wall of the apartment complex. Klinges and the adult male then got into a physical fight, before the police arrived. A records check revealed that Klinges is on probation. Klinges was placed under arrest for assault with a deadly weapon, child endangerment and for violating his probation. Klinges was booked into county jail.

- ☐ *Stay alert at all times with your head up and looking around.*
- ☐ *If you're worried about being out by yourself, ask a friend to accompany you.*
- ☐ *Walk with determination. A confident looking person is less likely to be attacked.*
- ☐ *Carry a cell phone or know where telephones are located.*
- ☐ *Trust your instincts. If you feel uncomfortable in a place or situation, leave.*
- ☐ *Call the police immediately if something happens to you or someone else.*

On May 8th, at approximately 12:53 hours, a UPD officer was patrolling the area of Wal-Mart. The UPD officer located a male subject he recognized as Scott Franks, a 30 year old transient. The officer knew Franks was wanted by Mendocino County Probation. The officer contacted Franks and a records check revealed Franks also had a Lake County warrant for his arrest. Franks was taken into custody without incident and booked into county jail. 17-1312

On May 9th, at approximately 1:21pm, UPD officers responded to the 700 block of Orr St. regarding two subjects who were refusing to leave the area. Upon arrival the UPD officers located the subjects identified and Kristine Tupper, a 43 year old transient, and Sean Wilson, a 41 year old transient. A records check of Tupper revealed two warrants for her arrest. Tupper was found to be in possession of drug paraphernalia and in possession of a controlled substance. A records check of Wilson revealed three warrants for his arrest. Both Tupper and Wilson were taken into custody without incident and booked into the county jail. 17-1323 (Tupper) and 17-1324 (Wilson)

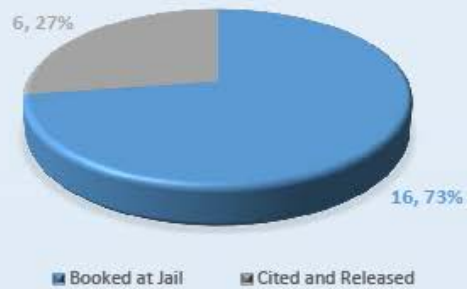

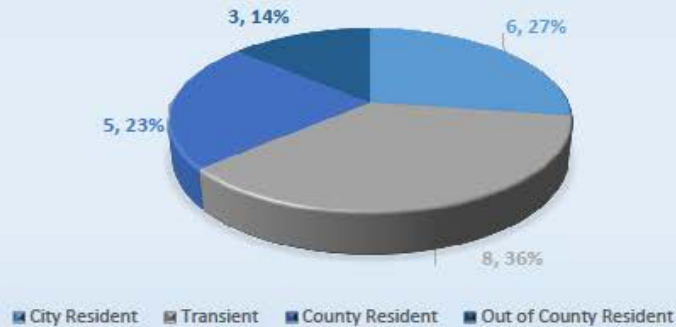
CRIME BREAKDOWN
