On 9-4-19 at approx. 1 PM, School Resource Officer Brett Chapman was notified by a Ukiah High School Assistant Principal of a threat that was made to a UHS teacher involving a “gun”. The threat was from a UHS student via a text message and was taken as a credible threat to the school campus. UHS staff, as well as members of the Ukiah Police Department immediately attempted to locate the student. Ukiah High School was placed on lockdown while staff and law enforcement were actively attempting to locate the student. Approx. one hour later, UPD was able to contact a family member who was with the student. The family member agreed to bring the student to his residence, where UPD personnel contacted the student. The lockdown was lifted. UPD arrested the student for 422(a) PC. The student was lodged at Juvenile Hall. UPD investigated the incident and there is no current immediate threat to the students or staff.
