Press Release **UPD Case # 19-2971**

On 11/1/2019 at approx. 1746 hours, Ukiah Police Officers were dispatched to 785 Village Circle unit G., for a report of a stabbing. Upon arrival Ukiah Police Officers made contact with a 17-year-old female juvenile in the residence who had a laceration consistent with a stab wound to her neck. UPD officers additionally made contact with a female adult who was identified as 18-year-old Shira Jessie Adams of Willits, and subsequently determined her to be the individual who stabbed the 17-year-old juvenile female.

Ukiah Police Officers detained Adams and provided medical aid to the 17-year-old juvenile female until medical personnel could arrive on scene and transport her to Adventist Health Ukiah Valley (AHUV) for further treatment. The 17-year-old juvenile female was ultimately airlifted to an out of county hospital. During the course of the investigation it was learned that the 17-year-old juvenile female was approx. 5 months pregnant at the time. Ukiah Police officers contacted numerous individuals at the location and determined that the incident had stemmed from a family disturbance.

Adams was subsequently placed under arrest for 664/187 PC (Attempted Murder) and transported to MCSO jail where she was booked and lodged. Adams' bail was set at \$250,000.
