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Ukiah Valley Water Authority

Joint Powers Authority (JPA) between 5 water utilities:


- City of Ukiah
- Calpella County Water District
- Millview County Water District
- Redwood Valley County Water District
- Willow County Water District

The City provides each member agency with operating and administrative services through a Joint Services Agreement (JSA).

For now, each utility will maintain a separate accounting of finances and reserves.

Calpella did not participate in the current rate study since a study was completed in 2024.

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* While the current project phase is focused solely on revenue requirements, UVWA will continue to actively work


Legal Requirements

for Setting Water Rates In California

Proposition 218 (Article XIIID, Section 6 of California Constitution)

- Revenues shall not exceed funds required to provide service; nor used for another purpose
- Amount shall not exceed the proportional cost of the service attributable to the parcel
- Service must be actually used or immediately available
- Approval process includes 45-day notice, public hearing, and written majority protest. Does not require a voting process (unlike taxes).

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
Reserve Policies

In addition to protecting the utilities Fund against unforeseen circumstances, reserve policies also contribute towards credit ratings.

Each member agency is proposed to maintain an **Operating Reserve** policy, which requires the utility to maintain cash reserves of at least 25 percent of operating expenses.

The Study also recommends that each member agency maintain a **Capital Reserve** policy relative to average annual capital spending. This reserve helps the utility absorb any spikes in capital spending or unforeseen infrastructure failure. The target reserve is recommended on a case-by-case basis, depending on the size/condition of the system and the capital spending program.


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

Summary of Rate Increase Drivers

- All agencies are facing cost inflation pressures
- All agencies (except the City of Ukiah) are significantly increasing capital re-investment
- Millview
 - Has not raised its rates in over 14 years
- Redwood Valley
 - Has unique operational and water supply challenges
- Willow
 - Significant shift from former role as operations service provider

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Summary of Objection Letters

Number of valid Objections:

City of Ukiah – X Millview – X Willow – X Redwood Valley - X

UVWA has prepared written responses to the Objections, which provides the grounds and substantive bases for which the concerns identified in the Written Objection does not result in a justification to amend the proposed increases to water rates. The concerns raised in the Objections are addressed in UVWA's written response and in the Rate Study.

UVWA staff recommends that the Executive Committee:

- a. Consider the substance of the Objections and the written response from UVWA staff; and
- b. Determine the Objections do not result in any amendment to or alteration of the proposed water rates.

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Public Hearing Next Steps

- 1. Open public comment
- 2. Make a final call for written protests
- 3. Close Public Hearing
- 4. Tally protest votes...and if majority protest does not exist:
- 5. Executive Committee to either:
 - a. Move to proceed to considering the proposed rates, or
 - b. Move to clarify or reduce the rates
- 6. Committee deliberation
- 7. Committee consideration of the four separate recommended resolutions

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
